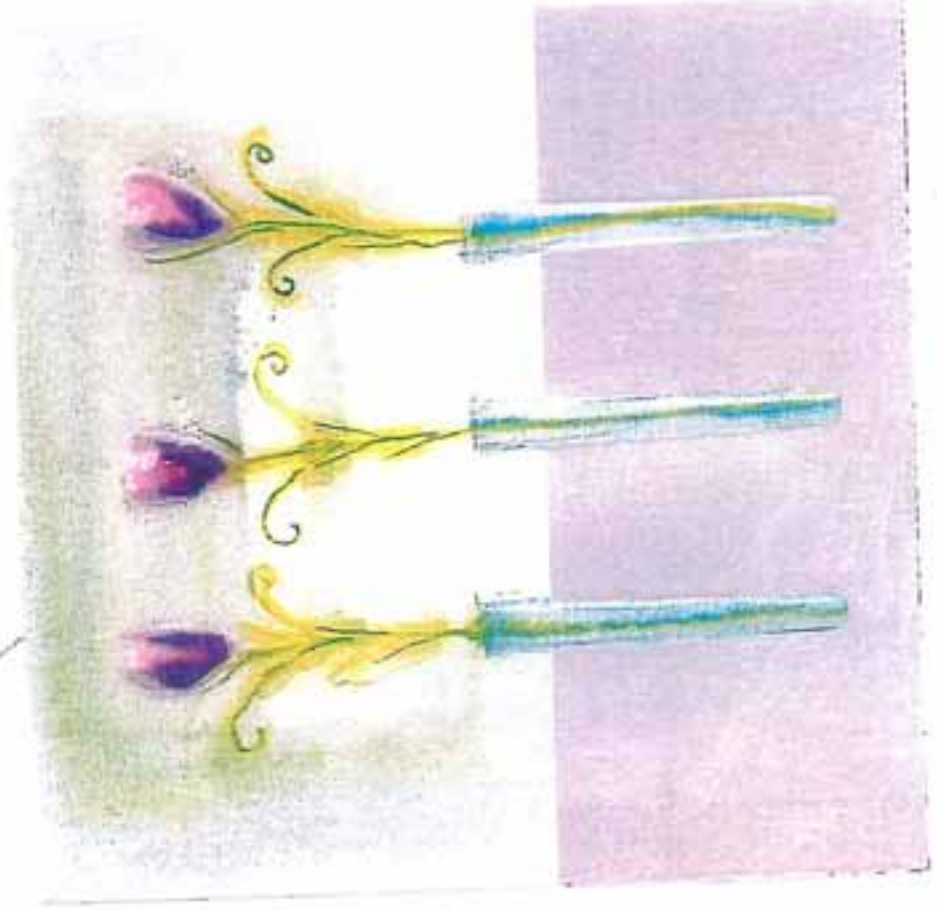

Dear Caroline,

First, I would like to thank you and congratulate you on the organisation of the conference last week. It was a great success and will be hard to match for future conferences to come!

I have taken good notes as I am currently up-dating the famous 'Bogs of Ireland' book by John Feehan. John asked me to rewrite the forestry on peatland chapter in view of all the research at the moment in that area. The like of your project didn't figure in the 1996 edition and so I would like to add a paragraph to this effect.

I have realised however that the figures I have taken from various presentation may need more precise definition! Perhaps you could confirm these to me or indicate a report where I could find this information:

136,576ha Coillte-own forest the west of Ireland only (?), of which 93% are on blanket bogs, 7% on cutaway and less than 0.1% fen. Does it mean ALL of Coillte-own forest in the West of Ireland are on peat soils?

126,330 ha are on blanket bogs in the west of Ireland only (I guess that's the 93%?)

LIFE project: 1212 ha + 776 ha. So a total of 1,988 ha restored. But that figure includes site in the Slieve Bloom for example which are not the west of Ireland.

What is the total Coillte-own forest located on blanket bogs?
